Your unwavering support has seen us through many challenges. Let's continue this remarkable journey, shaping a future where every animal is cherished and cared for.

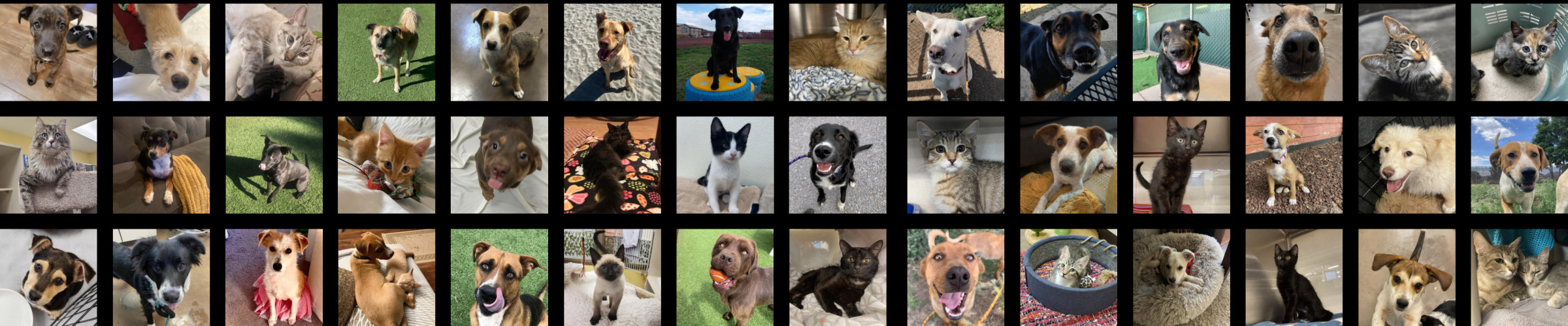

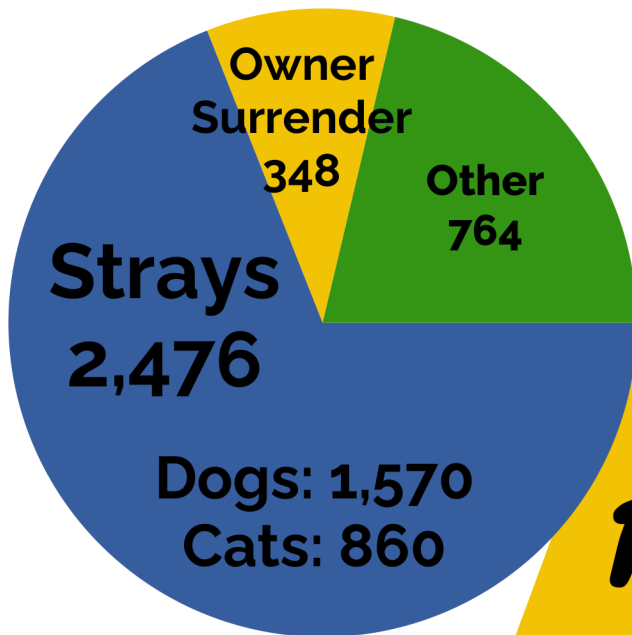

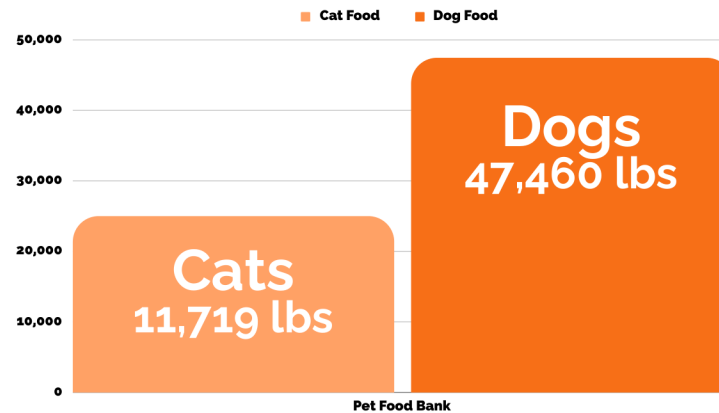

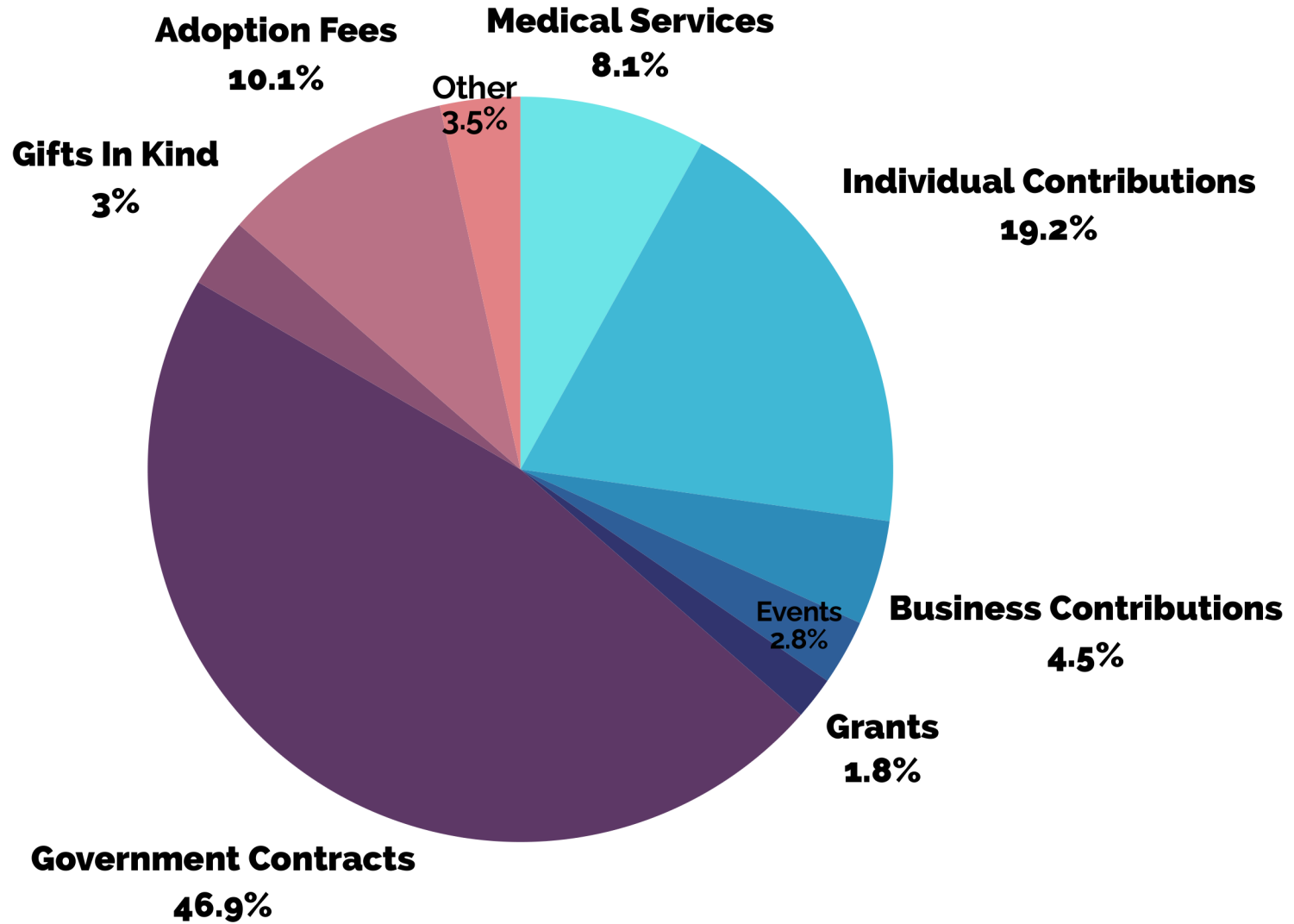

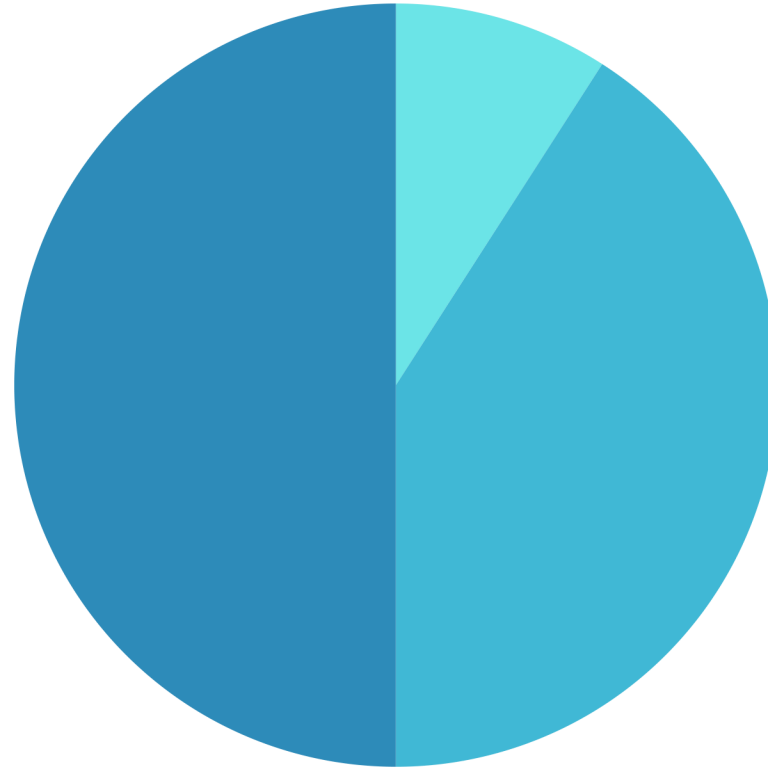
